COVID continues to impact on our lives, we currently have 5 staff isolating which is stretching our capacity significantly in school. Although we are no longer asked to support the NHS track and trace, we will continue to inform you of any positive cases in school to help us all be extra vigilant.

New procedures mean that from Tuesday 11th January, if we have a positive LFD test, we no longer need to confirm this with a follow-up PCR test. If children have a positive LFD test they can return to school after 2 consecutive negative results from day 6 of isolation.

In the news this week

he \$10bn (£7.45bn) James Webb Space Telescope, thought to be one of the most impressive and ambitious, has been sent into space on top of a huge rocket. On Christmas Day, scientists confirmed that the observatory, which has faced many delays, was operating well following a nerve-wracking lift-off. Described as a time machine by scientists, the telescope will allow astronomers to study the beginning of the universe shortly after the Big Bang, 13.8 billion years ago, and to hunt for signs of life-supporting planets in our own galaxy.
