## Learning Futures project

This project will enhance education through the use of digital technology for all our children at William MacGregor and the Arthur Terry Learning Partnership.

The core objective of Learning Futures is to immerse and embed technology within learning and teaching, enhancing opportunities and outcomes for all. To facilitate this, we have committed to provide every child with the technological tools to help prepare them for a future that will require a wide range of skills and knowledge.

As you know from my DoJo post the other Sunday, William MacGregor is in the Pilot Phase of Learning Futures. This means that every child will receive a fully funded iPad to use in lessons and for Yrs3-6 children, at home in September 2022. For our Ladybirds children, they will have access to 15 ipads to support their learning in school.
To ensure the effective use of technology, teachers will continue receive ongoing professional development. iPads will be used to enhance the existing curriculum.

To help make Learning Futures a real success, we are committed to ensuring you, as parents or carers, will have all the information and support you need to engage with this exciting stage of your child's time with us. More information and engagement events will be launched in the autumn term.
