I have been really impressed with how good our whole school attendance has been this week; the best week in a long time -98.2%! However, the number of children arriving late has been quite significant. Please remember that the school day begins at 8.40am. Any child who comes through the school office after the gate has closed (8.40am) is marked as late and if this is after 9am then an unauthorised mark is given as registers have closed. Our whole school attendance target is 97% and children are aiming for the same. Please remember that we can issue Calpol with your consent in school and that all holiday requests in school time will not be authorised.

A reminder too please that PE kits are plain black bottoms and tops with a plain house coloured t-shirt. Trainers should only be worn on PE days. As we have returned from Easter, I am seeing more multi-coloured PE tops and more trainers on school uniform days. Please come and see me if you need any support with uniform.

Since we have returned from Easter, you will know that our menus have changed for lunch. I understand that this has caused some problems with the choices children have. The menus are designed for children to try different things they may not do normally. I do know though that the sandwich options have been an issue. From the 9th May, Jo will now be making ham, tuna or cheese sandwiches and baguettes each day. So if you choose the sandwich option on the menu, Mrs bannister will find out what filling they would like on the Tuesday morning for the rest of the week. Choose the wrap/sandwich or baguette option and we will sort from there as we cannot change the menu on MCAS once it is on. Please, please, please also choose your child's food by the Monday evening at 6pm for the following week as this needs ordering. Some children have not been on the lunch lists this week as choices were not chosen in time and therefore have not had their preferred choice. Any lunch question or query then please direct these to Mrs Bannister in the school office and not directly to Jo. Our change to the lunchtime routine in and outside has gone really well and the children have fed back how much they are enjoying it.

Thank you to all parents who came to parents evening this week. I hope you were able to have a purposeful discussion with your child's teacher and find out how they are progressing in school. Your child's teacher will have told you about things they can do to improve as we are always striving to be the best we can be. I am so proud of the learning the children display on a daily basis particularly our year 6 children who are working so hard in preparation for their SAT tests in the next few weeks. Their dedication to early morning and after school tutoring has been amazing and I know they couldn't be any more ready. If you would like any further support, please do not hesitate to contact me. Year 3 and 4 parents have had an added bonus over the last two weeks as they got to see their child's learning explained by the children themselves in their show case events. Well done to all the children involved who spoke with confidence and clarity in presenting their learning to adults - great oracy learning!



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

Why is high attendance important for your child's education?

As a parent/carer you want the best life chances for your child/children. Being in school every day gives them the very best chance of achieving this. GCSE'S may seem a long way off for your child but 90% of children with average attendance at primary school and into secondary school of around 85% fail to achieve 5 or more GCSEs and one third of children fail to gain any.

Poor attendance in school will limit children's ability to achieve their full potential and this will impact opportunities in life.



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
