Today we finish for our 3rd half term which means we are half way through this academic year - the time goes so quick. What a busy half term it has been; especially with our OFSTED visit. The children continue to demonstrate our core values on a daily basis and apply these to the wonderful curriculum they are exposed to. Most children have now had an opportunity this year to complete some learning outside of the classroom or have a trip planned soon. Year 3 children had a wonderful experience last Friday when they visited the MAD museum (Mechanical art and design) and butterfly farm. The children have told me about all the wonderful technological inventions they saw. They loved building marble runs on the magnetic wall!! Year 1 and year 5 have visited the space centre to bring their class learning to life, year 1 also visited Bolehall this week learning all about the local area and where William MacGregor led a school. Year 4 have completed a residential at Whitemore Lakes and excitingly our year 5 and 6 children are off on London and Paris residential over the next few months. Year 6 also have an exciting careers morning at Arthur Terry school the first day back after half term. We continue to explore our offer for children not only to bring learning alive but to expose the children to as many experiences as possible. Thank you for your help in allowing this to happen through financial contributions and lots of volunteering.

After half term, on Wednesday 1st March, the NEU teaching union will again go on strike. I am not anticipating this will affect the opening of classes that day and as on the previous strike day, I am fairly confident we will be able to open as normal. The children were treated to a lovely assembly yesterday from two ladies who work at St. Giles. If you remember, this is the charity we raised all the money for prior to Christmas with the Ruldolph run event. Children learnt about their work and where this money will go. Our school councillors were able to present a cheque of £3,208 to the charity - they were so proud of their achievements as you should be. St. Giles gave all the children a bag that they will bring home today.

This week, we also had our termly disco and it was so well attended. The children had a wonderful time. This would not be possible without our fantastic and dedicated PTA Friends group. Thank you all so much who helped set this up and volunteered on the night. The total raised was over £500. We have had to move the next event of Easter bingo until after Easter as the Y6 children are in France when it was due to take place, so I have also changed the date of non-uniform day for donations for this. When we have a confirmed date for both, I will let you know.

Theses dates are on the calendar but a reminder that our year 2 and year 6 children will complete their statutory assessment tests in May and these are compulsory so no time off can be given or taken during this time. Year 6 - 9th-12th May. Year 2 - 15th-26th May.
